

## **INCENSE CEDAR**

Incense Cedar's botanical name is Libocedrus decurrens. These fence pickets, rails, and posts are one of the most durable and decay-resistant Native American wood types. It is produced from trees in California, Southern Oregon, Northern California, and Western Nevada. Sapwood is white or cream colored and the heartwood is light brown or light reddish brown. Incense Cedar used for fencing is typically white or cream colored.

**Lengths:** 4', 5', 6', 8'

**Widths:** Nominal: 4" 6" 8"

Actual: 3 ½" 5 ½" 7 ½"

**Thickness:** Nominal: 1" 1"

Actual: 5/8" 3/4"

**Grading:** Fencing is appearance-graded and categorized by knot size/type and defect, which impacts the visual appeal and performance as a fence board. Boards are graded for 2-face appearance or 1-face appearance.



Incense Cedar has exceptional resistance to decay and high durability when exposed to weather. Incense Cedar may be painted or stained in any of the vast variety of finishes.

Availability for fencing is typically the Midwest to Texas and west to California. Fences styles constructed range from solid board vertical or horizontal solid board, board on board, alternating panel.
