

REDWOOD

Redwood's botanical names are Sequoia sempervins and Sequoiadendron giganteum. These fence pickets, rails, and posts are one of the most durable and decay-resistant Native American wood types. Fencing is produced from trees in Northern California and western Nevada.

Availability is typically the Midwest to Texas and West to California. Fences styles include Solid Board Vertical, Solid Board Horizontal, Board-on-Board, and Alternating Panel.
